



How you can help your son / daughter with A Level English Language

1. Create a timetable

- Students can do this for the week ahead or month ahead.
- It should allow for breaks and social time
- Cover all the different areas in the English Language A Level syllabus
- Check revision tasks have been completed and use rewards when tasks are completed

1. Read together

- Read newspaper articles and discuss what is being represented in them and how
- Read a variety of texts from different sources and discuss their features
- Look out for news stories or opinion articles about how people use language - how would different theorists react to the ideas?

1. Language in the wider world

- Discuss the different factors that affect the way people talk
- Encourage reading beyond the syllabus in the work of the theorists
- Look at texts from a variety of different cultures and by people with a variety of different backgrounds
- Read widely around the history of language, particularly how changing historical factors influenced language change

1. Use resources

- Use Google Classroom to ask teachers questions and look at model answers
- Create flashcards with key points to remember
