



Year 9 FRENCH

In Year 9, students continue their French learning by building on prior learning from Years 7 and 8, as well as being introduced to a wider range of vocabulary and specific GCSE exam skills. Retrieval practise is done consistently across the subject to ensure that they revisit vocabulary and key grammatical skills, to continue building confidence and securing their knowledge. Students will be encouraged to use the three main tenses (past, present, future) frequently in their written and oral work. The range of activities in lessons include a variety of opportunities for students to acquire and apply language skills in listening, reading, speaking, writing and translating. Lessons are initially teacher-led and students are provided with opportunities to work in pairs or in groups or independently. Lesson content is culturally based in order to enhance students' enjoyment and knowledge of the French-speaking world. In the final term, Year 9 students will start the GCSE course.
