### Fact of the week

A recent statistic, released by St John's Ambulance, has revealed that 140 000 people die each year in the UK from incidents where first aid could of possibly saved their lives this includes nearly 900 people who choke to death, 2 500 who asphyxiate from a blocked airway and 29 000 who die from heart attacks.
