

Top 12 Careers support for Students across the school

The full **Careers Programme** is available on the Stokesley School Website and **reviewed every TWO Years (next review date is September 2022)**

This provides an overview of what students in each year group can expect during each term, covering:

- **CEIAG lessons, activities and events which are 'embedded'**
 - **'Additional' activities /events which might be subject to change**
 - **'Subject Specific' CEIAG.**
1. **LIFE Curriculum** - all year groups, lessons mapped to Gatsby Benchmarks and CDI Careers Curriculum and covering LMI, Career Planning, CVs etc.
 2. **Careers Internal Website (replacing google classrooms)** - divided into sections for each year group and including parents: news updates/LMI information and resources/competitions etc
 3. **1-1 Careers Guidance Interviews** - offered to all students upon request and scheduled for all students in Y11. Written feedback & personalised resources are always given.
 4. **Whole Year Group Activities** - every student will participate in at least one whole year group Careers Activity every year. ALL involving outside providers/employers/professionals/Alumni/Business Links- examples:
 - Y7 Enterprise Challenge
 - Y8 Enrichment Day Careers Workshops
 - Y9 Careers Speed Networking
 - Y10 Mock Interviews
 - Y11 Careers Fair
 5. **CEIAG Platforms** - GROFAR / Globalbridge / START - all students access and utilise at intervals throughout their school career. (student progress monitored)
 6. **Careers Fairs** - onsite Further Education Careers Fair (for all students in Y10 & Y11 organised in school) and UCAS Careers Fair visit for Higher Education (Y12 & y13)
 7. **Guest Speakers** - Assemblies/ in-class(could be subject specific / virtual. To raise awareness and inform on opportunities and/or specific careers. e.g. Apprenticeships (ASK), BBC Bitesize, Preparation for Work Experience or Mock Interviews, NCS (National Citizens Service), Employers and Providers.
 8. **Offsite Visits** - visits to Workplaces, Colleges, Universities for tours, tasters, workshops, competitions and exhibitions. e.g. Rotary Technology Tournament, Bring it on! (STEM Exhibition), National Apprenticeship Show.
 9. **Onsite Events** - sometimes using external providers and sometimes organised by school. e.g 'Careers Information Evenings' with a specific focus, to be attended by students and parents/guardians e.g. Careers in Engineering, Creative Careers, Apprenticeship Information Evening.
 10. **National Apprenticeship Week & National Careers Week** - Subject Ambassadors for Careers in each curriculum area liaise to organise a range of activities for the whole school.

11. **Subject Ambassadors for Careers** - liaising with Careers Lead to ensure subject areas are linking to careers education e.g. use of LMI resources, guest speakers, events/competitions, careers discussions
12. **Work Experience** - for the whole of Y10 to launch next year. (cancelled due to Covid19 in 2020)
