



Year 7 English

Year 7 aims to link to prior learning in primary school across a number of units that also aim to link with the kinds of themes and knowledge students will need to perform well at GCSE as well as engendering a love and passion for the subject.

- The Autobiography Unit links to work they've done on identity and non-fiction in primary school but also looks ahead to the types of texts they will need to answer on Paper 2 on Language Paper 2.
- The Romantics will build on the poetic techniques they learned in primary but a knowledge of these will be crucial at GCSE and A level. Brain in Gear and retrieval tasks will be used to reinforce and embed this knowledge. The Romantics also appear on the poetry cluster for GCSE so a knowledge of them will be crucial at KS4.
- The Hound of the Baskervilles unit will give students the experience of reading a whole text together. This book is a canonical text that will introduce to students to 19th Century prose (also a component at GCSE Literature) as well as giving them an introduction to Crime writing which appears later at A Level.
- The Creative Writing unit seeks to build cultural capital and help them learn the kinds of Classical allusions that occur later on in Shakespeare and other texts. The writing element also helps students develop their writing skills through lessons that explicitly focus on grammar and sentence structures to help reinforce learning from primary while also looking towards the writing components at GCSE Language.
