### **Help them to be organised:**

Each student has been given overviews of the syllabus content, so encouraging use of this to shape revision will be very helpful. We follow the AQA course, taking options 1D Stuart Britain and the Crisis of Monarchy 1603-1702; 2R The Cold War c1945-1991 and then component 3 Historical Investigation into the fall of Tsarism in Russia. <https://www.aqa.org.uk/subjects/history/as-and-a-level>

### **Get them kitted out:**

We have offered revision guides for sale for each of the examination units. These are still available if not yet purchased (see ParentPay). For each of the examination units and the historical investigation there are reading lists available which recommend additional books for wider reading. In addition to being available to purchase from retailers, many of these are in the school library or can be borrowed from the History Department.

There is a huge amount of material covered in the two examination units, so developing techniques and producing personalised resources to remember the content is crucial: flash cards, mind maps, grids, tables, cartoon strips etc.
